# Instructions to authors

The journal GEOGRAPHY publishes scientific papers in the following fields: physical geography, landscape geography, social geography, cartography, geoinformatics and landscape management. Papers in geoengineering and educology are also welcome. Papers are published in Lithuanian and English. All papers are reviewed.

GEOGRAPHY is published in two issues per year. Papers submitted before February 1 can be included in the first issue. The second issue of the journal is composed of papers submitted before September 15.

The manuscript text should have an abstract (max 150 words) with key words, introduction, 2–5 chapters and conclusions. The paper should not exceed 15 pages. The text should be printed 1.5 lines spaced in Times New Roman 12 pt font. Lithuanian authors should present also summary in Lithuanian (with title and key words).

Figures should be self-explanatory and of best possible quality. They may be presented directly in the manuscript. Diagrams and charts should be presented in \*doc or \*xls file formats; for cartoschemes and photos, please use \*cdr or \*tiff file formats (resolution at least 300 dpi). Colour copies of figures are obligatory for the internet version of the journal.

Keep tables as simple and short as possible. Make sure their layout is clear.

The manuscript should be submitted both in electronic (MS Word) and paper forms. ## **Examples of references**

References in the text should be put in parentheses, indicating the author's name and the year of publication. In cites with groups of authors, provide only the first one, for example, Wang et al., 2008. The list of references should be made in alphabetical order.

The titles of books and collections of papers in Cyrillic should be transliterated into Roman script. Journal titles in Cyrillic should be given in full and transliterated.
